Vera Slavtcheva-Petkova is a Vice-Chair of the Worlds of Journalism Study and Regional Coordinator for Central and Eastern Europe. She joined WJS in 2016 as PI for Bulgaria. She is a Reader in Global Journalism and Media at the University of Liverpool, UK. She leads the one-stop platform on journalists' safety safetyofjournalists.org launched in 2023 in co-operation with UNESCO as well as the WJS global index on journalists' safety (safetyofjournalists.org/index).
